

Navigating Life's Conflict (The 30 Sayings of the Wise)

Listen. Learn. Lean. That's Solomon's advice for applying *The 30 Sayings of the Wise* to our conflict. *Listen* to the sayings by opening our hearts (Proverbs 22:17). *Learn* these 30 wise words so that we can recall and speak them when conflict arises (Proverbs 22:17-18). *Lean* on God, not ourselves or the sayings (Proverbs 22:19). If we *listen*, *learn*, and *lean* on God, then we will have knowledge, good advice, truth, and answers for our challenges, moving us through life's conflict toward community (Proverbs 22:20-21).

Join us on a journey through wisdom's chartered waters as we examine thirty navigational beacons to help us travel safely through life's seven seas: (1) finances, (2) friends, (3) faith, (4) failure, (5) family, (6) fools, and (7) future.

Finances

We are called by God to wisely steward our capital resources. *The 30 Sayings of the Wise* surfaces five pearls to help us navigate through life's financial conflict. Left unchecked, this handful of gems can become a quintuplet of anchors that will drown us in a sea of debt. Solomon's selections address litigation, debt, integrity, wealth, and the poor.

Friends

It has been said that the most influential people in our lives are our friends. Perhaps that's why *The 30 Sayings of the Wise* includes a description of four friends that we should avoid making: the hot-tempered, slothful, troublemaker, and rebellious.

Faith

Wisdom applies our faith to our circumstances, literally sticking God's character to our challenges. *The 30 Sayings of the Wise* combines God's heart with street smarts addressing our: work ethic, self-control, speech, and motives as we connect our vertical commitment with our horizontal conflict.

Failure

Failure might not be final, but ignored, it can be fatal. *The 30 Sayings of the Wise* describes four pitfalls that can kill: lies, sexual misconduct, addiction, and distress.

Family

Family is the ultimate picture of God's love. The Apostle Paul teaches that family derives its name from the Father. In *The 30 Sayings of the Wise*, Solomon offers four pillars to construct a firm foundation for a God-honoring, loving home: learning, disciplining children, honoring parents, and building connections.

Fools

The antithesis of a wise person is a fool. *The 30 Sayings of the Wise* includes five concepts that both prepare us for dealing with a fool and help us not to become one. They include: reasoning with a fool, instructing a fool, scheming, stealing, and gloating.

That hope comes exclusively from God. *The 30 Sayings of the Wise* offers four practical ways for us to experience God's hope on this side of heaven: don't envy sinful people, seek wise counsel, get wisdom—fuel for the soul, and don't worry about the wicked.
